HOW TO WATCH LGMF VIRTUAL EVENTS

There are many options for watching our virtual events. Here is some helpful guidance:

How do I get started?

- -First, purchase your Virtual Series tickets online here >>
- -After purchase, you will be sent a confirmation email with a password. Save this password!

Where will be videos be showcased?

All videos will be uploaded on our Virtual LGMF <u>Vimeo channel</u> September 13-18. When visiting our Vimeo channel, simply select the video and when prompted, enter the password from your confirmation email.

On what devices can I play the videos?

To watch on a computer: simply visit https://vimeo.com/channels/virtuallgmf
To watch on a smartphone or tablet, first download the Vimeo app. Then, search for "Virtual LGMF" under "channels."

Can I watch the streams on my TV?

Yes, and this is our recommend method for the best viewing experience! Here are several ways to do this:

If you have a smart TV you can access our Vimeo page directly from the TV using the TV's built-in Vimeo app (you may have to "search" for this and download). Search for "Lake George Music Festival" under 'people.'

If you are watching on a Smartphone (iPhone or Android) or iPad you can "cast" wirelessly to your TV. Common casting devices are Apple TV, Chromecast, Amazon FireTV, and Roku.

How to watch via Apple TV:

If you have Apple TV, once you start the video stream on your device, tap the airplay icon and choose your Apple TV or AirPlay 2-compatible smart TV. Find more information on Apple TV casting here.

How to watch via Chromecast:

If you have a Chromecast-enabled TV, once you start a video stream on your device, tap the Chromecast icon at bottom right to "Play on TV" and choose your Chromecast TV. Read more about casting via Chromecast here.

• How to watch via Amazon Fire TV:

If you have an Amazon Fire TV, once you start a video stream on your device, choose the icon at the bottom and select your Amazon Fire TV. Read more about casting via Amazon Fire TV here.

How to watch via Roku:

If you have a Roku-enabled TV, once you start a video stream on your device, choose the casting icon and select your Roku TV. Read more about casting via Roku here.

Tip:

Make sure your smartphone, tablet, or computer are connected to the same wi-fi network as your TV.

Can I play the concerts on my non-TV stereo system?

There are a wide variety of ways to connect your TV, smartphone, computer, or tablet to an external sound system. Depending on its technology, all require cables for inputs, most commonly an HDMI cable or a 1/8 inch headphone jack. We recommend you ask for the right cable for your system at a store where cables are sold or search your exact system model specifications before purchasing.
